We believe that Canadian employers and professional bodies are yet to be fully aware of the quality of Sri Lankan enaineerina education. which consists of a completely merit-based selection and evaluation Many process. engineering professionals of Sri Lankan origin who immigrated to Canada have taken on career challenges and excelled in Canada in various capacities.



However, there has been no structured opportunity so far for aspiring engineering professionals as a community to network and share career experiences with senior engineering fraternity in Canada. As an association, we have identified at this point that a networking event with practicing senior engineering professionals, regulatory and professional bodies, education institutions, employers and recruiters will immensely benefit the aspiring engineering professionals in their endeavor for professional recognition, career progression and relevant employment opportunities. Key areas that we intend to highlight are Canadian experience, Canadian education and training and industry connections. General Meeting - 2019

General meeting of the Alumni Association of the University of Peradeniya – GTA and Suburbs (AAUPGTAS) was held at Burnhamthorpe Community Center, 1500 Gulleden Dr, Mississauga on October 05th, 2019.

Chitrica Pandithasekara, master of ceremonies (MC), welcomed the attendees and commenced proceedings of General Meeting-2019. As per the pre-notified agenda, outgoing Secretary Upul Herath presented the annual report, after which outgoing Treasurer Ranjith Perera read the audited financial reports for both 2017 and 2018, and the interim financial report for 2019.

The minutes of the 2017 General Meeting and the financial reports were unanimously approved. The forum unanimously approved the proposal to incorporate the Association as a 'Not for Profit' organization under Ontario provincial law. Then Jayalath Samarakkody, the outgoing President, addressed the attendees. In his address, he highlighted all the activities that were successfully carried out during the past two years and praised all the support the Association received from the membership and emphasized the unity and camaraderie among the membership. He concluded his speech by calling attention to expanding the membership.

Five renowned experts from different sectors were invited as panelists of the Business Forum, which was moderated by Dr. S. Maheswaran, Senior Lecturer, Faculty of Management.



Mano Ayya is no more!

Tribute to the late Dr. Jayalath Manorathna who passed away on January 11th, 2020

Born in a hamlet in Hanguranketha, he never lost his roots. He left as the same simple man. We are far from being qualified to talk about his massive contribution to the arts and culture of Sri Lanka and to the society. Volumes are written and presented about those in the last many days in many angles. Despite fake news about the condition of his health, we kept constant touch with his family and offered support whenever possible. Some of us were able to visit him in his sick bed quite a few times. Sadly, in the last few weeks he could only hear but not respond.

His strong bond with our Association began in 2012 when we hosted him and a few fellow artists for a hurriedly organized dinner. Probably the first time in his rich vocabulary, he used the term 'Peradeniya Old folks' (better explained in Sinhala as '*Peradeniya Adi Vaseen*') to address us. He identified the fun-filled Peradeniya style evening as a 'back to Peradeniya day'.

We invited him twice to light up our trademark public event 'Back to Hantana' in 2016 and 2018. While in full agreement to participate despite his busy schedule, his only focus was the success of 'Back to Hantana', never the payments – not sure how many will undertake overseas performances without such assurance. How he inspired and lifted the quality of performance of our group to public stage in two days was amazing. Humble man to the core, he was ready to perform with whoever we presented to support our cause. That gesture enabled us to place over one hundred adults and children to perform along side with him – a life time opportunity to many. Never would he approach any one with anger. We saw how he used humour to convince or correct others when needed.

We were privileged to see his intellectual capacity and knowledge when developing themes, programs, scripts and selecting people. His ability to connect with any audience instantly is truly unthinkable. Those who were present at 'Back to Hantana' 2016 and 2018 episodes would vouch for that. Despite his stature and wisdom, he was still a great student. Last time, he lamented missing out of an opportunity to visit Canadian Theatre. Eagerness he displayed to explore Drumheller Museum in Calgary was another testimony.

He was elated to see our attempt to showcase Sri Lankan arts and culture in Canada and commended us for undertaking such initiatives as hardly such attempts are made even in Sri Lanka today.

We will require several terabytes of data capacity to capture his humour. When someone asked how the drinks supply by Peradeniya folks in Canada was, he quipped 'Oh plenty but they gave me a thimble to drink'.

Without our knowledge, he had been our stellar global ambassador too. He had shared many good stories of our work with his contacts outside Canada.

With a sobering heart, we attempt to absorb memories of his voice, performance, wit and touch. We will continue our journey of promoting Sri Lankan arts and culture as a tribute to dearest *Mano Ayya* – a great son of Peradeniya.



Obituaries

Prof. Vini Vitharana



Eminent Sri Lankan Language, literature, religion and archeology educator Prof. Vini Vitharana passed away on Dec 1st, 2019 at the age of 91. He was born on June 2nd, 1928 in Tangalle.

Prof. Vitharana was educated at the University of London (bachelors with honors, University of London and Master of Arts, University of London, 1959). He was an assistant teacher at Mahinda College, Galle from 1949 to 1953, and St. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia from 1954 to 1957. He completed his Doctor of Philosophy at the University of Peradeniya in 1966.

He rose from lecturer to associate professor of Sinhala during his 21-year tenure at Vidyodaya University from 1960 to 1981. He was professor of Sinhala at Ruhuna University from 1981 to 1993. He was a visiting professor at several higher education institutions - Postgraduate Institute Archaeology and Research in Colombo, since 1993, Buddhist and Pali University from 1996 to 1997, Sabaragamuwa University from 1997 to 1998 and Sri Jayewardenepura University.

Prof. Vitharana served as assistant editor of Sinhala Encyclopedia attached to the Ministry of Cultural Affairs. He was a recipient of award for Sinhala Literature in 1962. Prof. Vitharana was the President of the Panel for Sinhala Literature of the Ministry of Cultural Affairs from 1970 to 1977 and Assistant Director of UNESCO Sri Lanka Cultural Triangle Project from 1981 to 1985.

Prof. M D Dassanayake



Emeritus Professor of Botany of the University of Peradeniya and colossus of Sri Lankan botanical landscape Professor M D Dassanayake passed away recently in Kandy.

Born in Kurunegala in 1921 and educated at the government boys' school Kuliyapitiya and Dharmaraja College Kandy, he passed London Matriculation at the age of 17 and had to wait until he was 18 years old in order to enter the then Ceylon University College to read a Medical Degree. Without a free education system and due to great depression, he had to instead follow a degree in science from 1938. He was in the first batch of 3 students reading a special degree in botany. He read his MA at the University of Cambridge and PhD at the University of Manchester from 1955 to 1957.

He joined the Department of Botany of the University of Ceylon and later the University of Peradeniya and served until his retirement in 1988. The late professor Dassanayake was the first head of the Department of Botany.

Among many contributions to science in Sri Lanka, he is credited with his teaching of botany at the University, contribution to the Flora Ceylon Project, Plant Genetic Resource Centre and also being the Chief Editor of the National Journal of Science (Botany). In his honor, every year since 1991, The Professor M D Dassanayake Gold Medal is awarded to the best student in the Botany Special Degree program at the University of Peradeniya. A plant species endemic to Sri Lanka in the tea family discovered by two taxonomists in Nuwaraeliya and Badulla areas was named 'Gordonia Dassanayekei' in recognition of his contribution to botany in Sri Lanka.

We are saddened by the demise of Prof. Dassanakaye, an illustrious Sri Lankan, and wish to convey our condolences to Mrs. Dassanayake and the family.
