New Main Library building

Foundation Stone - Laying ceremony of the New Main Library building was held at the auspicious time, of 6.02 a.m. on Friday, 18th August, 2017 under the patronage of Prof. Upul B. Dissanayake, Vice-Chancellor, University of Peradeniya who laid the 1st Stone accompanied by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor Prof. R.L. Wijeyeweera and the Deans of Faculties of Medicine - Prof. Vajira Weerasinghe, Agriculture - Prof. D.K.N.G. Pushpakumara and the Veterinary Medicine & Animal Science - Prof. H.B.S. Ariyarathne. Mr. N.T.S.A. Senadheera, former Librarian, University of Peradeniya attended as a special guest at this historical event.

Prestigious Engineering Award for the Faculty of Engineering

On 20 July 2017, the project "Mitigation of Pollution at Kandy Lake and Mid-Canal, Sri Lanka" has been awarded the Prestigious Engineering Achievement Award (PEAA) by the Institution of Engineers, Singapore (IES).

The project was collaboration between UOP's Faculty of Engineering and the Nanyang Environment and Water Research Institute (NEWRI, Singapore). Dr Shameen Jinadasa, Senior Lecturer at the Department of Civil Engineering was the project's Principal Investigator.

Camp Fire











The first ever **Camp Fire** organized by the Association for the members and the families was successfully concluded in August 19th, 2017 in a remote farm land in Erin.

Though the event started bit late due to slow arrival of the participants, it worked in our favor as we gained more night time to enjoy.

The location in a remote farm land in Erin was ideal for our purpose. The atmosphere in the foot of the slope of the farm land only surrounded by the high grass and distance tree lines perhaps looked far better than the surroundings of 'Wala'.

The approach foot path in the downhill lit by dim solar lights led to the square Camp Fire area. In four corners were the glowing white TPs (Native style tents) and the each arm of the square had well positioned citric torches and Peradeniya style lamps to complete the right ambient for the Fire and participants.

Though we did not anticipate the chilly weather provided bit more natural Peradeniya feeling. There were plenty of camp food and thirst quenchers to keep the energy. The intensity of the growing spirit continued to rise as the night grew and the tempo was unstoppable till we made a conscious count down after mid night to douse the 'Fire'. Kids too had a gala time though at times it was challenging to keep them restricted to the premises.

Those who were present experienced the true **Peradeniya spirit** and what it can do.
